Vinnies Christmas Grotto

A huge **THANK YOU** to our participating Christchurch schools, the Catholic Diocese of Christchurch, staff, the National Library of New Zealand team, customers to Vinnie Stores, our parishes and all who gathered and collected gifts for this appeal. Invitations were discerned by schools and agencies to families they identified who have a greater need this Christmas. This year the invitation was also extended to agencies such as Aviva, and Catholic Social Services. A special thank you to North Parish, who generously provided the free use of the parish hall at St Joseph's Papanui for 5 days. It was a blessing to have a place and space, where people could comfortably access. We were able to lay out the Grotto in a way that people could choose what their children would enjoy whether gifts, books, games, or toys. We also had enough donations for the parent/caregiver to choose something for themselves. The joy of both giving and receiving was witness to the Spirit of Christmas.

This year several staff from the Catholic Diocese used their "Day of Good" and joined our conference members to support visitors to the Grotto. This new initiative available to diocesan staff allows them to spend time in the community by serving and putting their faith into action. The shared mission of the Church and St Vincent de Paul society was very visible in the message of the Grotto, in supporting those who are most in need.

Over the three days more than 1200 donated gifts were distributed. An atmosphere of gratitude, love, sharing, and compassion was very evident in both the visitors and the volunteers. It was very uplifting to witness SVdP members from different conferences who did not previously know each other, meet, and establish comradeship through the joint mission of the society.

Whilst it took a team to make the Christmas Grotto a success, a special thank you to Shelley the SVdP Conference Coordinator who supervised the operation of the Grotto over the 3 days. The last thank you goes to Papanui conference member William, who was like an onsite guardian angel over this time and who vacuumed the whole venue at pack down

Transitional Housing Project in Pavitt St, Christchurch Warm, affordable housing for families

This exciting venture began as an idea in 2016 when Vincentian, Brian Gardner conceived this idea. After six years of planning and fruitful fundraising, the light at the end of the tunnel is ever so close with the completion of these apartments scheduled for later in December 2022.

This project is an initiative of Ozanam Canterbury Charitable Trust, a collaboration between the Society of St Vincent de Paul and St John of God Hauora Trust.

The HOPE Project is set to commence in February 2023, supporting young parents at the seven-unit Pavitt St development in Christchurch. The HOPE Project supports vulnerable young parents with a range of supports that meet individual need, including social work support, as well as a range of pregnancy and parenting support and education services.

Young parents will be supported in their 12-month Transitional Housing term with St Vincent de Paul providing tenancy management support and the St John of God Waipuna Young Parents Development team providing the wrap-around support services.

Mike Daly, Ozanam Canterbury Charitable Trust Chair, said "we are hugely appreciative of the support of such a broad range of philanthropic supporters and organisations that have facilitated this project. We are fortunate to be working with the experienced team at St John of God Waipuna to provide high-quality support."

St John of God Waipuna delivers a range of wrap-around support services focused on individual need, ranging from individual and group youth mental health counselling services, adventure-based support for at-risk youth and young people who have offended, as well as a range of services supporting young parents.

Kath Prins, General Manager Community, Youth and Child Services, said "Pavitt St will provide safe, secure and stable housing for seven young families. Our team via the HOPE Project work alongside these families, supporting them with individual social work support and services."



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Thank you Penny

Penny joined Vinnies at Stanmore Rd SVDP at the beginning of 2011 – so worked at Vinnies for 11 amazing years! She started working 20 hours per week on administration and was later appointed as Operations Manager and in the final year took on the new role of Vinnies Conference Coordinator.

Penny reflects on her time at Vinnies – she had been with us for 6 months when an engineer found that the Stanmore Rd building was unsafe and so the shop traded out of the sorting room whilst the shop was rebuilt - this being a 2-year process. Penny was also involved in establishing a Vinnies shop at Hornby shop – this on a shoestring budget which necessitated the revamping of what was a small gym into what is now a lovely big shop. She also assisted in the rebuild of our Papanui shop and helped with organising a temporary shop at Bishopdale shopping centre. She also started up the Christmas Grotto some 6 years ago and it is great to see that this idea has become a regular part of the Vinnies Christmas plan.

Penny was also a valued member of the National VOSPR Retail Advisory Board with the highlight of her term on this committee being the significant increase in turnover following the makeover of the Nelson/Richmond Vinnies Store. She was also a member of the Pavitt St Housing Committee in its early stages as concept plans were developed and fundraising initiatives commenced.

Penny's highlights during her time at Vinnies was hosting on two separate occasions, two International Presidents in Christchurch - Michael Thio (Singapore) who attended a National AGM then came to Christchurch for a few days and then Renato Lima de Oliveira (Brazil).

When the 150th committee had its first meeting nothing pointed to the huge job they had on their hands...... She loved every bit of it and the smiles and the whole atmosphere of the celebration was worth every minute she was even seen drinking water instead of Coca Cola to get her through!!!! But still to this day calls it her biggest highlight of her SVDP career !



When Penny decided it was time to move onto newer pastures, she moved to Food Bank Aotearoa to take up a role Business Administrator and is thoroughly enjoying her new responsibilities in a very relaxed environment. On reflection, Penny has missed all the people she worked with at Vinnies but has not missed the 100 odd emails she received each day!!!! What has impressed her at Food Bank Aotearoa is that it has no income and is totally reliant on grant funding and receiving donations. Some 105 Charities feed off Food Bank Aotearoa with up to 6 tonnes of food being distributed each day – amazing and believe it or not they are exceptionally good at recycling – there is virtually no waste.

The event was attended by a large number of Vincentians and all agreed that this was the best Festival day ever held as a result of some very good presentations.

After a welcome by Fr Paolo, newly elected President Mike Moore provided an update on activities and issues being faced in the Canterbury Area, Sister Clare Murphy spoke on the 'Life & Mission of Jesus and the call of the Vincentians.' This was an inspirational presentation and all present agreed that it will provide an invaluable resource going forward, especially to our new Vincentians.

This was followed by a very important presentation by Kath Prins and Danielle Mora from St John of God (Haurora Trust). They spoke about the HOPE programme that will provide "wrap around services" to our clients at our new transitional housing apartments that are located in Pavitt Street, Richmond (behind the Vinnies shop on Stanmore Rd).

Interesting presentations came from Hannah Storey from The Loft, Carol Brown (Aviva) and Katie Dixon (Kainga Ora). Of significance to our members was the array of services available to those in need at The Loft that can be described as a "unique health & wellbeing centre" for Canterbury. These services are available at Eastgate in Christchurch. Then Carol and Katie spoke on the many and varied issues that affect people who are in social housing or awaiting to be housed in Canterbury – a question and answer session followed that provided an even greater insight into the issues faced by so many.

The day concluded with special Vincentian awards being presented to eight members who had completed 25 years or more service. In addition, Certificates of Service were also presented to Vincentians who had between 20-24 years of service plus our newly commissioned members also received a Certificate of Commissioning. The day concluded with Mass being celebrated by Fr Paolo.

Welfare Update 2022

Over the past year, demands for Welfare Services at St Vincent de Paul have continued to grow steadily. Mid-year we saw a slight easing off with demand due to government initiatives, but the need for help by many ramped up markedly in subsequent months, and especially over the past 3 months as the impact of inflation hits the pockets of our community. Recently, demand has increased as much as 25% and as is always the case, demand for assistance in the December period has skyrocketed.

Traditionally, Vinnies offers extra help to the community with Christmas Vouchers and this practice will continue for Christmas 2022. We have had some amazing financial support for this initiative from the Catholic Bishop of Christchurch (Bishop Michael Gielen), the Christchurch City Council Mayors Welfare Fund and other very generous donors – thank you to all for your generosity!

Supporting the significant financial help that comes via the sources noted above for helping to fund our welfare outreach, we also acknowledge the valuable work being done at conference level by our conference members who, not only search out for sources of material help for those in need, but also regularly look for opportunities to keep funds coming into their conferences via donations from supporters at parish, and community level.

In addition, a big thank you to all our Vincentian volunteers who are our face in the community and willingly deliver food and other support to families in the community!

Vinnies Welfare services will close on Tuesday 20th Dec at 11.00am and the service reopens on Monday 16th January 2023.
