I am delighted to be able to write about the highlight of this first quarter – the official opening of our major housing initiative on Pavitt Street in Richmond, Christchurch. Bishop Michael Gielen officially opened the Ozanam Apartments in early March. The apartments have been named in recognition of our founder – Blessed Frederic Ozanam. The young mums and their family will be able to live in safe and secure facilities with great support provided to them by staff from St John of God (Hauora Trust).

Our Welfare services are also being stretched this year given the tough economic times that we are all facing. These services have seen a jump in demand of nearly 15% in the first quarter of 2023 – and so, it is a big thank you to all the volunteers in our Conferences who do this most important work. May God bless you for your endeavours.

Trading at our Vinnies stores is always a challenge in difficult times, but we are aided by our very creative shop managers. I am delighted to advise that our Retail Manager is hosting an afternoon of boutique fashions at our Papanui store – this is being held on Sunday 7 May – do look for the item inside this edition on the details and how to acquire your ticket.

Our Conferences are currently in the process of considering Vinnies 2022–24 Strategic Plan and how some of these initiatives that have been listed can be undertaken. 

## Official Opening of Ozanam Apartments

Bishop Michael Gielen officially opened the Ozanam Apartments on Pavitt Street, Richmond on 3rd March. This event culminated more than 7 years of dedicated work by a number of Vincentians, members of St John of God (Hauora Trust) and the Catholic Diocese of Christchurch. The event attracted some 80 Vincentians, donors and supporters and was held at the Richmond Club in Christchurch. After brief speeches by Trust Chair (Mike Daly), Sarah Hillier (CEO, St John of God Hauora Trust) and Bishop Michael, we proceeded along to the Apartments where they were formally opened by Bishop Michael. All the visitors were able to inspect one of our 2- and 3bedroom units before returning to the club for celebrations.

The tenants of these Transitional Housing units will be young mothers and their families and will be supported with wrap around social services by St John of God (Hauora Trust).

The good news is that these fully furnished apartments are now debt free thanks to the generosity of grant funders, including the Hoatu Fund (administered by Bishop of Christchurch), the Hugo Trust, Kiwi Gaming Foundation, Maurice Carter Charitable Trust, Christchurch City Council (Endowment Fund) and the Eliza White Foundation. Our sincere thanks also go to all the other organisations that have generously contributed to this project. Special mention to the Elms and Commodore Hotels, plus the Warehouse for the various goods provided that helped furnish these units.

### Working with The Corrections Department

We have recently developed a relationship with the Department of Corrections. Last year we received a small supply of vegetables; this year we have been fortunate to get a regular consistent supply of vegetables from the prison gardens. These gardens are designed to feed the residents, and all surplus goes to a couple of Charities. These vegetables are harvested on the morning we collect them, they are beautiful and fresh, and we have been fortunate to obtain on a Wednesday Morning between 16–26 crates. Lots of potatoes, kale, and marrows which is then distributed to our Conferences. Given the cost of vegetables, we are truly blessed!

As well as vegetables, we have been given bed frames, clothing, books, and boots for our welfare mission. Plus, we are now trialling a new initiative with a sewing facility to recycle our 'seconds' – reducing land fill waste, and creating rags for sale, and the recycling of buttons and zips for sale also.

To all those involved in these initiatives from Dept of Corrections – thank you – this is hugely appreciated.

## Young Vinnies / Young Adults

Our Young Vinnies in the Ōtautahi area are thriving! During the Lent period our students have been involved with learning about the good works of the Society, service, community outreach, and volunteering. Most recently, our Vinnies at St Bernadette's School hosted an afternoon tea and games day for their community—It was a wonderful event with families, parishioners, and teachers attending. With the end of term one fast approaching, we are also collecting items from our schools as part of our Lenten Appeal which helps to stock our stores and subsequently raise funds for those we assist, thank you to everyone who has participated! # Vinnies Welfare Services during 2022 and 2023 to date


Demand for our welfare services during 2022 was at a similar level to previous years with over 7,220 requests, approximating over 22,000 adults and children who have received our support. Our first quarter of 2023 has seen a nearly 15% spike in demand – no doubt driven by inflation – resulting in increased prices for food, power, rent and mortgages.

Vinnies extends a big thank you to all our donors in Canterbury for your continuing support as without such we could not continue to provide our welfare services to the ever-increasing number of people.

Some interesting statistics from our database on 2022 services to people in Canterbury. These needs for assistance ranged from food parcels (76%), to bedding incl. sheets & blankets (8%), furniture (5%), Kitchen/whiteware (4%), power/firewood (3%).

In addition, our support extended to providing clothing, school uniforms & stationery, Christmas presents (from the Grotto) in December, additional Christmas food parcels plus free budgetary advice. These support services to our local community have been valued at over \$800,000.

A big thank you to our many donors for your continuing support – be it donated items or financial support. Without your amazing support, we could not have achieved the above results.

# Les Maloney (QSM) Vincentian - Hoon Hay / Halswell Conference

Les passed away on 13 January 2023. He was a Vincentian for some 29 years. He formed a Conference in Granity on West Coast in the early days along with another 5 members. These were the days that the giving of food wasn't required. Instead, they did 'good works' as an organisation with one of the major achievements being to turn a hall into a Senior Citizens Community Centre. Les achieved this by enlisting the help of many including the Mine's Department.

Les in those days was a Constable for New Zealand Police and was on every committee that was available, often as President or a Treasurer. Les was awarded the QSM (Queens Service Medal) in recognition of all his hard work.

When he retired from paid work, he joined the Hoon Hay / Halswell Conference and was a member for 20 years delivering food and holding the Treasurer position until ill health forced him to retire from active duty. Les was always a "Vinnie" at heart. Les is survived by his wife Pat – a Vincentian, his 4 children and grandchildren. Thank you for your amazing work Les – RIP.

Lord – in grateful memory of all our departed Vincentian brothers and sisters who have gone before us in the spirit of St Vincent de Paul, we pray that their dedication may inspire us to build a strong future for the Society.
